- Consumer Demand for Chiropractic Increases
 - Chiropractic profession is projected to grow "faster than average" compared with other professions from 2002 to 2012.
 - ❖ Projected employment increase of 21-35%
- US Department of labor Statistics
 - ❖ More visits to alternative providers than MD's
 - ❖ In 1990, research shows Americans made 338 million visits to primary care MD's
 - ❖ In 1990, research shows Americans made 435 million visits to alternative health care providers

 - 3. The older population of Americans is growing and so are their mechanical and structural problems that will increase their demand for chiropractic.
 - 4. The chiropractic profession is more researched and documented and this is changing attitudes towards this non-invasive health care practice.
 - 5. The American population has an increased ability to pay for chiropractic services with surplus money available after their basic needs are met.
